My submission concerns and is limited to, the re-allocation of Council buildings in Woodville.

The current number and size of Council owned buildings in the centre of Woodville is clearly in excess of what is required now and in the near future.

ex INFRACON Building

From our personal experience owning Digbys opposite, the ex Infracon building is poorly located as far as operating a commercial enterprise such as the iSite is concerned. Parking, signage and

profile conflict at this busy intersection. People drive past. Despite some assertions to the contrary it is not a good spot!.

The current iSite location is very much more convenient for passing travellers.

I submit that the **ex Infracon building** and land be either sold in entirety, or the buildings demolished to make way for a much needed, future looking and convenient town car parking area large enough to also take a few tour coaches.

Looking to the more distant future, this intersection is quite likely to require some major re-alignment to cater for the ever increasing size and numbers of trucks using it.

ex TDC/Alliance Building

The existing Library/Service Centre operation should be re-located into the ex TDC building opposite. A more private service desk area could be created to overcome the existing total lack of privacy at the service desk. This could be carefully arranged without any need for increased staffing. Good parking is available immediately in front and to the rear of the building. The library footprint would become expandable within existing walls.

Existing iSite Building

The existing iSite and Lindauer Gallery should be retained as is, with the vacated library area turned into a District display area/waiting room for bus transit passengers. The existing toilet facilities should be enhanced for public use during business hours with an after hours toilet with an external only access door.

The iSite should be enhanced with it's own staff restroom/toilet facility. Parking is very good both in front of the iSite and around the corner in Grey Street. A 'ranch slider' style external door to be installed in the western wall connecting directly to the Bus shelter.

Costings

Based on the very limited cost estimates which were available at the time of this submission, it seems likely that the cost of earthquake strengthening the building would not be too dissimilar to the alternative cost of demolition. Added into this equation as costs would be moving the Lindauer Gallery, moving the Tree Sculpture and much of the increased cost of a new stand alone building for some Public toilets. Ratepayers may well appreciate that this option may well have the potential not to need any additional new funding.

Summary

By adopting the above approach, the town would retain in the ISite building, an attractive and comfortable facility with convenient parking and access, public toilet facilities, outdoor seating, the Lindauer Gallery and the Sculpture. Over the road, the Library/Service Centre would become more spacious, more workable, and leave some room for expansion and/or any future additional TDC requirements. Good convenient off street parking would enhance the CBD and make life safer for both drivers and pedestrians.

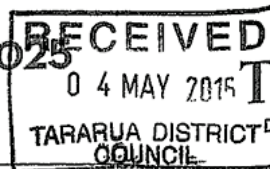
Whilst I concur that the possible financial returns on the sale of the ex Infracon building may not be as great as some would suggest, the return should be sufficient to fund most of the cost of developing the other two buildings. Plus TDC will retain these two upgraded and attractive buildings as real and tangible assets.

I believe that much of the Woodville Community would see the logic behind the above.

My submission concerns and is limited to, the re-allocation of Council buildings in Woodville.

The current number and size of Council owned buildings in the centre of Woodville is clearly in excess of what is required now and in the near future.

ex INFRACON Building

From our personal experience owning Digbys opposite, the ex Infracon building is poorly located for as operating a commercial enterprise such as the iSite is concerned. Parking, signage and

profile conflict at this busy intersection. People drive past. Despite some assertions to the contrary it is not a good spot!.

The current iSite location is very much more convenient for passing travellers.

I submit that the **ex Infracon building** and land be either sold in entirety, or the buildings demolished to make way for a much needed, future looking and convenient town car parking area large enough to also take a few tour coaches.

Looking to the more distant future, this intersection is quite likely to require some major re-alignment to cater for the ever increasing size and numbers of trucks using it.

ex TDC/Alliance Building

The existing Library/Service Centre operation should be re-located into the ex TDC building opposite. A more private service desk area could be created to overcome the existing total lack of privacy at the service desk. This could be carefully arranged without any need for increased parking. Good parking is available immediately in front and to the rear of the building. The library footprint would become expandable within existing walls.

Existing iSite Building

The existing iSite and Lindauer Gallery should be retained as is, with the vacated library area turned into a District display area/waiting room for bus transit passengers. The existing toilet facilities should be enhanced for public use during business hours with an after hours toilet with an external only access door.

The iSite should be enhanced with it's own staff restroom/toilet facility. Parking is very good both in front of the iSite and around the corner in Grey Street. A 'ranch slider' style external door to be installed in the western wall connecting directly to the Bus shelter.

Costings

Based on the very limited cost estimates which were available at the time of this submission, it seems likely that the cost of earthquake strengthening the building would not be too dissimilar to the alternative cost of demolition. Added into this equation as costs would be moving the Lindauer Gallery, moving the Tree Sculpture and much of the increased cost of a new stand alone building for some Public toilets. Ratepayers may well appreciate that this option may well have the potential not to need any additional new funding.

Summary

By adopting the above approach, the town would retain in the ISite building, an attractive and comfortable facility with convenient parking and access, public toilet facilities, outdoor seating, the Lindauer Gallery and the Sculpture. Over the road, the Library/Service Centre would become

more spacious, more workable, and leave some room for expansion and/or any future additional TDC requirements. Good convenient off street parking would enhance the CBD and make life safer for both drivers and pedestrians.

Whilst I concur that the possible financial returns on the sale of the ex Infracon building may not be as great as some would suggest, the return should be sufficient to fund most of the cost of developing the other two buildings. Plus TDC will retain these two upgraded and attractive buildings as real and tangible assets.

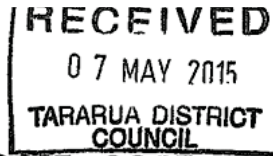

Submission for Tararua District Plan – Woodville Service Centre:

When I worked in the Tararua District nearly 40 years ago as the sole Policeman in Woodville I found that the town was heavily influenced by the Railway workers population and the support for a successful racing industry in the town. Crime was relatively high and there was not a lot of optimism for future development in the town, as when asked, most could not see a bright future.

I decided to retire in Woodville as I saw a bright future for the town. The Railway industry population has gone, the racing industry is really very insignificant but in stead the prospect of families moving to Woodville for affordable housing is great. The last two population census showed that the town had remained static with a population of 1401 while the population in the rest of the Tararuas is declining. With comparatively high housing prices in the main centres like Wellington, Kapiti Coast and Palmerston North and Feilding Woodville and the Tararua District is shaping up as a great place to move to. With the efforts that the Tararua District Council has and is still striving to achieve with the up dating of the Saddle Road and the Gorge, there is no doubt that families with young children or retirees are going to continue to seriously look at Woodville as a great place to live.

I am heavily involved with the award winning Pioneer Museum and we are facing an uncertain future with having only a membership of 13 people and a declining number of people visiting because the Museum is seen as a non changing “clutter-buck” type of old style local town museum. With great efforts from a few, two major displays have been staged which attracted a huge interest from not only within but outside the Tararua District. This has highlighted to us that Tararua as a district has no major gallery display space. It does has a huge traffic volume flowing through Tararua with Woodville as the hub collecting all of. Specifically, the McLean and Vogel Street intersection, (the joining of two major high ways) is a potentially vital site for capturing the attention from this traveling public. While it may be only one of several options for obtaining a gallery space it does provide, in my opinion, an exciting option for meeting this unmet need for suitable gallery space within the Tararua District. It is an opportunity that will most likely not be available for long and will not occur again if this site is sold for other purpose.

As a rate payer and now also a retiree, I have elected to become involved with Woodville District Visions, more especially with the Walk Way project to the Gorge and the progression of up dating Fountain Square. I am also involved with the Woodville Pioneer Museum and the Lindauer gallery.

The Lindauer gallery will have a huge exposure this next few years with the Celebrations currently going on in Pilson, with their major University becoming involved with the selection and support of an artist in resident from there to work in Woodville and with luck, the publication on the definitive work of the artist Godfrey Lindauer in Europe and New Zealand. From my viewing of the visitors book and comments I am amazed at the number of tourist from outside New Zealand that make the visit to the gallery and i-site in Woodville. I am concerned that the viability of the Lindauer gallery will be severely threatened by the current proposal to the relocate the i-site and Library/Service Centre to the Service Centre, especially if the building is cleared and converted to green space.

One of my major concerns in Woodville is the fate of the library and I-site building. It is hard to evaluate regarding this site what might be in the best interests of the Woodville community and the interests of the wider Tararua district when there are no published reports of the earthquake vulnerability of this site, how those estimates of vulnerability were obtained, nor the potential costs of remedy if that were an option to be followed. It would be extremely unlikely that Council would allow staff or the general public to be in that building now if the vulnerability of the building was currently

rated high to severe. That does not mean that the building vulnerability does not pose a future risk to Council either physically or financially, but it is hard to participate in consultation over its future without knowing this information. One might even question whether good faith consultation is possible or has occurred in its absence.

Looking to the future I believe that the council has to reduce its land holding in Woodville and convert that to selling property with the end aim of producing more rates to the Council. Any proposals have to be carefully considered from many aspects, not the least the financial implications for the Council and ratepayers.

I believe that the Tararua District Council needs to produce the written facts to support their current idea of the relocation of the i-site and Library/Service Centre to the Service Centre. At this stage it is difficult to support this idea without due consideration of some of the other proposals put forward.

I urge the elected Councilors to consider that this is an opportunity where they should listen carefully and thoughtfully to what the Woodville people are asking and look at and weigh up aspects of all the proposals from the public - from the Library through to the Pioneer museum. I urge the elected Councilors to take the time, to respectfully engage and develop a properly detailed plan which ratepayers have time to consider and comment on.

Through this means the Tararua District council will end up with a destination point including iconic Lindauer gallery, library, i-site, museum, exhibition space and service centre which will benefit not only Woodville but become a destination within the whole of the Tararua District for domestic and international tourists.

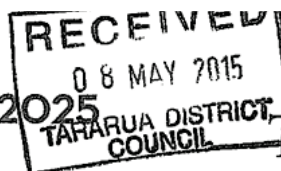

4. Woodville Buildings

We find it disappointing that the Library and Service Centre has been labelled "earthquake prone". This building is probably less earthquake prone than many of the CBD buildings in Tararua and just because it is owned by the Council does not mean the Council should be able to behave (demolition) differently to the private sector.

The combination of, i-SITE, Lindauer Gallery and Rose Garden we feel work well together and it would be a shame to break up this combination given the reasonable amount of parking available on this side of the road.

Option 1

We propose strengthening the whole Library/I-SITE building and incorporating an upgraded Service Centre and toilet for bus users. The proportion of the building used for the library will reduce over time releasing more space.

Option 2

Demolish the Library/Service Centre, strengthen the I-SITE building and build new toilets for travellers next to the i-SITE. (toilets would be more aesthetically pleasing if they were incorporated with an existing building rather than being free standing.) The Library and Service Centre have nothing in common with the I-SITE and could be moved across the road to the Tararua Alliance building. This option would make available a limited area for planting and the Woodville Tree where it currently stands could be shown off to much better effect.

Both of the options presented by the District Council and the WDV proposal would concentrate more parking activity and more pedestrian activity close to the intersection of State Highways 2 & 3. We find this highly undesirable in the interests of road safety. The potential of more signage around this intersection adds more distractions at a point where motorists should be focusing on approaching traffic. Indeed we find it surprising the NZTA did not prevent the erection of the scrolling sign outside the I-SITE.

SUBMISSION ON TARARUA DISTRICT COUNCIL DRAFT LONG TERM PLAN 2015 - 2025

Local Approved Product Policy

We recommend that the Council establish a Local Approved Product Policy (LAPP) under sections 66 to 69 of the Psychoactive Substances Act 2013.

At this point in time there are no approved products available for sale, nor are there any retailers licensed to sell them. However it seems likely this situation will not last forever and, given the special consultative procedure required for establishing an LAPP which has to meet Section 83 of the Local Government Act, commencing this process sooner rather than later would be advisable.

While the legislation does not *require* a Territorial Authority to produce or share an LAPP it is preferable to have the ability to exercise some local controls over these businesses. Many neighbouring councils including: Horowhenua, Rangitikei, and Palmerston North councils have LAPPs.

Although the LAPP only enables the T.A. to control location of premises, (by reference to any or all of: geographical areas; proximity to other retailers of psychoactive products, or premises/facilities of specified kinds – e.g. schools, mental health), without a Policy, T.A.s might find themselves in the potentially undesirable and irreversible position of having any number of retailers granted licences to retail at any location in their area.

If an LAPP is in place its provisions are taken into account by the Psychoactive Substances Regulatory Authority when considering applications for licences.

Without a LAPP to refer to, the only relevant restrictions will be those under section 52 Psychoactive Substances Act 2013 and subsequent regulations. [Psychoactive Substances Regulations 2014] (These mainly excludes dairies, groceries etc; service stations; licensed alcohol premises, residential premises and places likely to be frequented by minors.)

Local Alcohol Policy

The Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 is intended to give communities more say in how alcohol is made available in their local area. The primary instrument for this is the production by territorial authorities of a Local Alcohol Policy for their region. [Part 2 – Subpart 2; sections 75 - 97].

The process of developing a LAP would not only clarify the licensing rules for the District, it would also enable the residents to have their say on these often contentious issues. A LAP could set guidelines that balance competing interests; consider local factors, and control the impact of these on the district and its inhabitants. [e.g. location, density, proximity, trading hours, one way doors and other conditions. Section 77.]

We understand the development of a Local Alcohol Policy (LAP) has been put on hold until there is some resolution around the potentially precedent-setting challenges to other LAPs. When these are resolved we look forward to being involved in the development of a policy that will best serve the Tararua District Council and its communities.

It would be good to see Council taking leadership on this issue, not only giving a voice to its communities but also making management of the alcohol sector easier for officers. We would be more than willing to be involved in this process.

Tobacco

Council will no doubt be aware of Central Government's goal of achieving a smoke-free Aotearoa by 2025. This would bring enormous health, social and economic benefits to the Tararua District and to the country. We encourage Council to include this goal in your long term plan.

We recognise and appreciate Council's past support with the implementation of smoke-free parks and playgrounds. We encourage you to extend your current policy to include other areas, and Council-run events, particularly those frequented by children. We are currently working with a number of other local authorities, and would be happy to help your Council in this regard.

Not only would a broader smoke-free policy support children to remain smokefree, and smokers to quit, it would also help to reduce litter from cigarette butts and empty packets, making outdoor seating areas more attractive and reducing costs for the Council and Ratepayers.

Pensioner Housing

We recommend greater consideration of the options available to Council for the future of its pensioner housing, including greater clarity about what is being proposed.

We also recommend greater clarity on what Council expects from providers of social housing beyond "Existing tenants continue to live in subsidised social housing units" stated in the Long Term Plan.

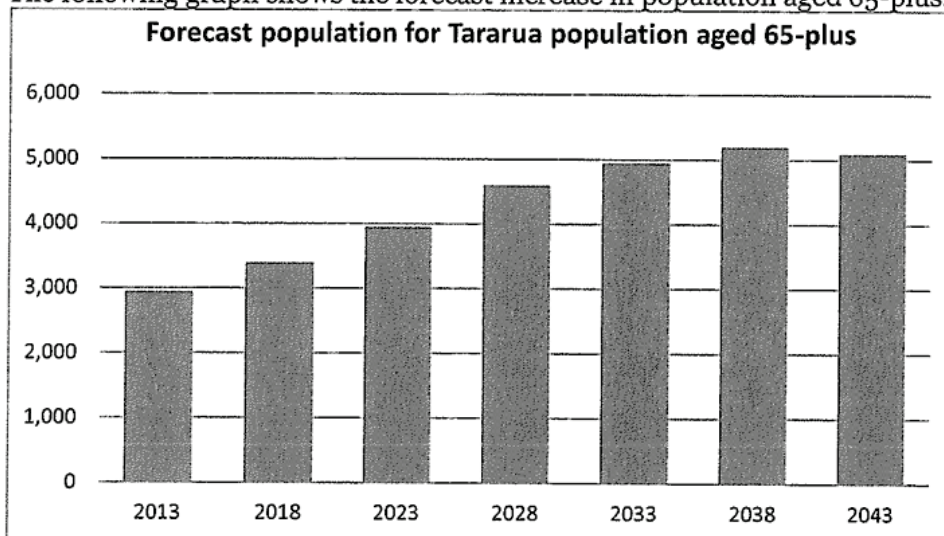
Relevant questions include:

- For what time would the new provider have to provide housing to the tenant (is it as long as the tenant wishes)?

- Could the costs of maintaining the units be offset by rises in rents? Rents seem to be low when compared to what other Councils charge¹ although we acknowledge that it is difficult to compare rents without knowing other factors (such as market rentals, condition of units, etc)
- For what time period would the provider have to provide social housing for the elderly? (Hamilton City Council specified ten years² but we would not agree with a ten year limit.)

Ten years is too brief to cope with Department of Statistics³ population forecasts for people aged 65-plus living in the Tararua District which shows the 65-plus population peaking in 23 years time at 5200 compared to 2,950 in 2013. .

The following graph shows the forecast increase in population aged 65-plus.



There are a number of options other than selling the housing stock, which we believe that Council needs to consider, including:

- We note that Christchurch City Council has retained ownership but will set up an entity with a 51% holding in Council social housing to manage the properties and which will receive government subsidies⁴. Perhaps a similar model could work for this district?
- The Manawatu District Council transferred ownership of its social housing and management to a trust with its members appointed by Council⁵.

In summary, we recommend:

- More clarity around what is proposed and future conditions on any sale or transference of management;
- More consultation on what option would best serve the towns with pensioner housing.

Safe Community

We recommend that Tararua District Council seeks to gain accreditation as a World Health Organisation Safe Community. There are now 27 designated Safe Communities in New Zealand (or more than a third of all local District and City Councils). This includes Palmerston North City Council who through the Palmerston North Safety Advisory Board achieved accreditation last year.

International Safe Communities is a World Health Organisation (WHO) concept that recognizes safety as "a universal concern and a responsibility for all"⁶. The programme encourages greater co-operation between non-government organisations, the business sector, local and government agencies.

The WHO Safe Community model has already been adopted by several smaller rural councils, (e.g. South Wairarapa and Tairāwhiti Districts (<http://www.safecommunities.org.nz/sc/summary>)).

We believe that Tararua District Council is a responsible Council and has a good history of improving the safety of its residents in many areas but there are other gains that could be made relatively easily by the Tararua communities.

Becoming part of the Safe Community Network would allow Tararua District to identify successful projects in other districts that might be suitable for local use. Working in collaboration with other groups would allow Council to increase the safety of its citizens without necessarily increasing the burden on rate payers.

We would be happy to help collate any injury or hospitalisation data specific to the Tararua District or help an application in other ways in collaboration with Tararua District Council.

Swimming Pools

We thank Council for a funding provision of \$500,000 towards the renewal of pools in Pahiatua and Eketahuna.

We note Council's comment that the funding is not sufficient to completely rebuild the existing facilities but would like to record our support the provision of swimming pools as these encourage people to learn to swim and also provide a swimming environment with fewer hazards than river-holes.

The Water Safety Council lists as a key element in its water safety code ⁷

- Learn to swim and survive.

New Zealand still has a high number of people drowning ⁸ (there were 90 provisional drownings in 2014, including 4 from the Manawatu Whanganui region). Increasing the proportion of New Zealanders who can swim will help reduce the drowning toll. Providing pools within easy access will increase the chance of children learning to swim and thus becoming safer and more physically active.

Exit from Services – Kerbside Refuse Collection

Council has proposed exiting the kerbside refuse collection service in 2018/19. This proposal needs serious consideration and an assessment of all the implications before the final decision is made. The proposal signals a significant change and we would recommend a Health Impact Assessment (HIA) or a "Health in All Policies" approach be undertaken to assess the implications of the proposal. As solid waste collection is a core service under Section 11A of the Local Government Act 2002, it is appropriate that Council undertakes a rigorous assessment of the impact of exiting the service. In the Waste Management and Minimisation Plan 2011 – 2017 Tararua District Council accepted that health impact assessments would be useful, but that these would be addressed in the next WMMP in 2017.

1. What are the potential impacts of the policy proposal on the identified determinants of health? (consider the following)
 - social and cultural factors
 - population-based services
 - economic factors
 - individual and biological factors.
 - environmental factors
2. What are the potential impacts on health *outcomes*? (Consider each determinant in turn).
 - physical health
 - family and community health
 - mental health
 - spiritual health.
3. How will the policy proposal address the principles of partnership, participation and protection for the Treaty of Waitangi?
4. What are any potential effects on health inequalities? (Consider whether inequalities could be reduced or widened – refer to background section of the Guideline where there is an explanation of health inequalities. Who would be most affected?)
5. In particular, how will the policy impact on people with disabilities?
6. What might the unintended health consequences of the policy be? How will these be addressed?

In any assessment of the unintended consequences of exiting the service, we submit Council will want to consider the following:

- The risk of increased waste going to landfill. People will only buy stickers for the bags they need. However people may feel they should fill up a regularly collected bin that they are paying for.
- The impact for those on fixed incomes, e.g. the elderly.
- The risk of increased fly tipping when people cannot get Council stickers and have not made arrangements with other providers.
- The risk that people may choose to stockpile waste on their own properties, leading to increased risk of nuisance conditions (attraction of vermin and creation of conditions that are injurious to health, harmful or offensive).

- The risk that Council will have less information on the contents of the waste stream to support the Waste Assessment.

Council has advised that the cost of private providers is low because of competition. How much competition is present in the market in Tararua District at this time? In the Waste Management and Minimisation Plan 2011 – 2017 Council advised there were at least 5 private collectors of general waste. Is this currently a true indication of competition for general waste services in the district? Council should also summarise the investigations into the delivery of services through joint District tenders or joint operations as outlined in the Waste Management and Minimisation Plan 2011 – 2017.

Infrastructure

Thank you for the 30 year infrastructure strategy and the LTP Wastewater and Water activities for 2015 – 2025. The infrastructure strategy outlines public health and environmental outcomes.

When reviewing submissions, setting priorities and possibly modifying the LTP we consider that the meeting of legislative requirements and works necessary for the protection of public health should be considered non-negotiable. We strongly support the Council in the provision of infrastructure that benefits public health.

We support Council's proposal to improve performance for infrastructure as outlined in the performance measures through the long term plan. However we note that performance targets have not been clearly established for some of the performance measures under water supplies. Some baseline for water loss and consumption should be available now, even if this is an estimate of water loss based on night-time flows and consumption estimated from total water volume produced.

Summary of Recommendations

We recommend that the Council

1. Undertakes a Health Impact Assessment (HIA) or a "Health in All Policies" to assess the implications of the proposed exit from kerbside refuse collection.
2. Broaden your current Smokefree policy;
3. Establish a Local Approved Product Policy
4. Consult with Public Health Services when restarting development of the Local Alcohol Policy
5. Develop more clarity on future conditions for pensioner housing that is needed to preserve or improve services to the elderly in the case of sale or transference of management of the properties;
6. Consult in greater depth on the future of pensioner housing with the affected townships and their environs;
7. Consider seeking accreditation as World Health Organisation accredited Safe Community;
8. Notes that Public Health Services has offered to work with Council on consulting around and/or developing the above policies; and
9. Notes our support regarding the importance of swimming pools to Pahiatua and Eketahuna.

Introduction

The Manawatu Mountain Bike Club has been in existence since 1988 and currently represents 450 members – the largest cycling club in the region. Over 85% of our members hold a “family” membership and we actively encourage families to join by putting on a number of family friendly, non-competitive events and activities.

MMBC has a strategic plan that focuses our efforts, not only on running great events and activities for our members and the general public, but also on building relationships with land managers, so that we have access to places to ride off-road. Our focus has been to build relationships with land managers of a number of areas in the region where our members currently ride, or could ride if trails were developed.

MMBC have worked closely with PNCC at Arapuke Forest Park and we have been able to advise and to some degree manage projects for the council, lowering the cost of these activities to PNCC. We have also worked closely with DOC to establish the Te Ara o Mahurangi Trail in the Manawatu Gorge Scenic Reserve at Woodville and have learned a few lessons along the way that will help to lower future trail costs.

MMBC have been active to establish two alternative new at Raumai Rd, Santoft, Ranfurly Rd in Feilding and also Foxton Beach. This was done due to the loss of Arapuke Forest Park to logging for the best part of two years from 2010. In all these areas, we have endeavoured to build sustainable trails that require minimum maintenance, do not encourage erosion and have the least impact on the environment.

In total, MMBC have constructed and maintain over 30km of Mountain Bike Trails at Arapuke, Woodville, Raumai, Ranfurly Rd and Foxton. We see building trails as a key strategic focus for our club and where possible try to create trails which the public can access at no cost.

Arapuke Forest Park

MMBC have been involved at Arapuke since the original consultations on the KORA plan and before. We have designed and managed the construction of 12km of mountain bike trails over the last 3 years as logging of the old forest allows.

We offer the following information as our club has developed the skills to design and manage trail construction at a cost significantly less than commercial operators.

The trails that have been restored have been getting great comments from those that we meet out riding, online via Facebook and from those who rode in our recent Kahuterawa Challenge race. This race attracted entries from Wanganui, Levin and Wellington.

The partnership where MMBC has managed construction has been extremely good value for PNCC in that they have created a recreational asset for a fraction of the cost of using commercial operators. The 12km of trails has been constructed for a total input of \$36,000, plus around 2000 hours of volunteer labour. Typically commercially built trails, as are being currently being constructed in Wellington, Kapiti, Hawkes Bay, Taupo and Rotorua, cost between \$10,000 and \$15,000 per km.

This effort is unsustainable for a volunteer organisation and we are looking to have similar costs in future to complete the Arapuke trails to become a network of trails between 24km and 30km in length by the end of 2021

This will be a significant recreational resource for the region, attracting visitors from the lower North Island, especially Wellington, many of who may have travelled to Rotorua in the past.

Manawatu Gorge Trail

We are also actively working to get a dual-use trail through the Manawatu Gorge and acknowledge the support we have received from council staff toward this goal and to ensure safe access to the trailhead from the Gorge Car Park. If this trail can be created it will rival other successful dual-use trail projects, such as W2K and the Kawakawa Bay trails, near Kinlock, Taupo

MMBC has supported DOC in their goal of building a dual-use trail for mountain bikes, runners and walkers, through the Manawatu Gorge Scenic Reserve. www.mmbc.co.nz/tracks/manawatu-gorge. Our members have been involved in creating and promoting a survey of potential users and this has highlighted the bottled up demand for more mountain biking, mountain running and active recreation opportunities in the region. With over 1000 respondents, the survey indicated that more than 16,000 annual user visits would be generated. Actual usage could easily be 2-3 times that amount. Our vision is for a trail separate from the existing walking track, to minimise user-conflict.

This would be an iconic trail for the region and complete the puzzle, so that off-road adventure style events, as well as great mountain bike and mountain running events can be held in the area. The river, walking track and mountain bike trail, form the three elements needed for popular adventure races (kayak, run, mtb). The venue would put Palmerston North in the same league as Rotorua, where such an event can be held in close proximity to a major city.

Another benefit would be to allow access to areas of the Manawatu Scenic Reserve for pest and weed control, that are currently very difficult to access. Better access would lower the cost of biodiversity programs

We believe that the Manawatu Gorge Trail is one of the most significant and exciting projects in the region that could return the expected \$400,000 investment many times over for businesses in the region. The Te Ara o Mahurangi trail at the Woodville end has been constructed and has proven popular with riders over summer when Arapuke has been closed due to logging. This trail was a partnership between MMBC and DOC, to further gauge usage and confirm how popular the trail could be. While the end result has been pleasing, many lessons have been learned along the way regarding better ways to design, construct and control cost.

We urge Tararua District Council to continue to support this project. With support from all stakeholders and the community, we believe that the funding for this project can be found and the benefits to the community, both financially and in health and enjoyment could be significant.

Tararua Off-Road Cycle Loop

The creation of Mountain Bike Trails at Arapuke and Te Apiti – Manawatu Gorge, leads to the obvious connection of these venues using mostly existing infrastructure. Our vision is for an off road loop that starts and finishes at Palmerston North and connects the city with Ashhurst, the Tararuas and Linton to form a loop of over 100km.

Using the Riverside shared trail to Ashhurst and crossing the Manawatu River on the proposed pedestrian bridge, the trail would continue through Te Apiti - Manawatu Gorge, then continue up Hall Block Rd and pass through the Tararua windfarms along North Range Rd. The trail would then cross the Pahiatua Track before continuing along South Range Rd.

The current access permit system for the Palmerston North water catchment area, would need review to allow the proposed trail to travel along South Range Rd to meet the top of the Sledge Track. Other areas allow recreation in water catchment areas, for example the Hunua Ranges in Auckland is both a water catchment and a mountain biking area. A small section of new track would need to be created to connect from the extended Sledge track to Gordon Kear Forest – a distance of 3-4km. Forestry roads could be used to get to Scotts Rd and from there to Arapuke Forest Park.

For some time an off-road trail from the Kahuterawa Reserve to Linton following the Kahuterawa Stream has been talked about to create a safe connection to Linton. The actual distance could be as short as 3km to connect Kahuterawa Reserve and Hewlitts Rd. The proposed commuter cycle path from Linton would complete the loop back to the city. The vast majority of this loop is actually in place, with only a few short connections needed to create a loop that can be completed as a whole or in sections.

What would MMBC like to see in the Long Term Plan?

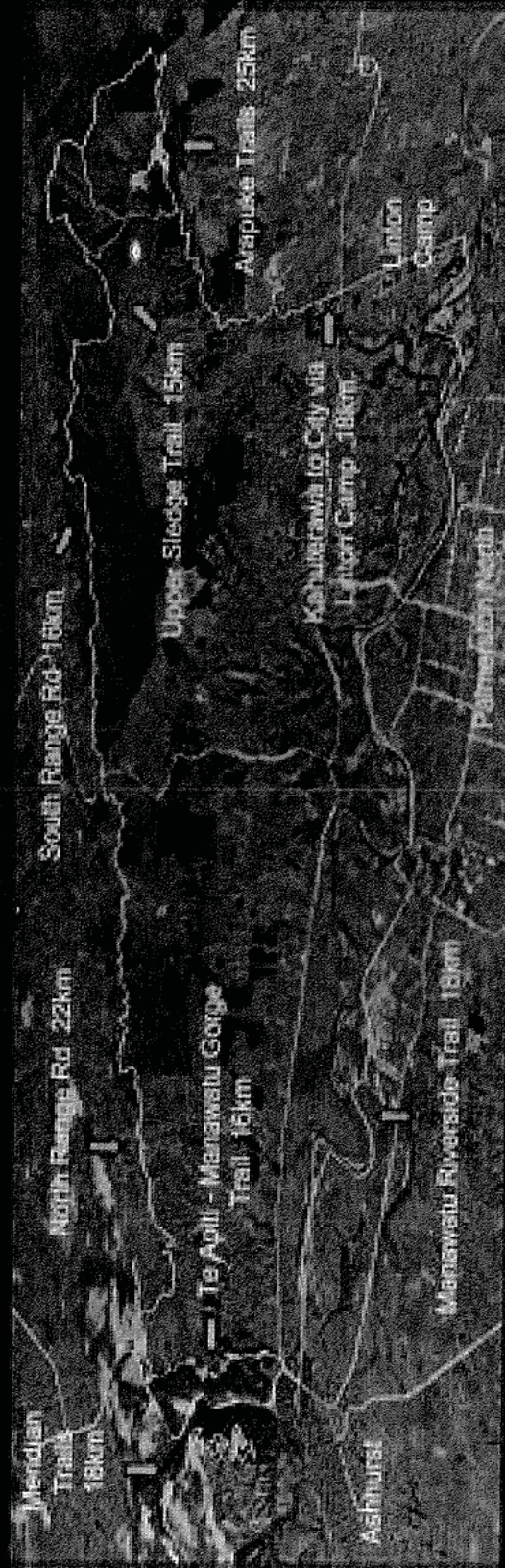
MMBC are pleased to see a commitment to Te Apiti – Manawatu Gorge by Tararua District Council. What we would like to see confirmed are the following

- A clear commitment to financially support a cycle trail through the Manawatu Gorge Reserve, in partnership with other stakeholders. This commitment from stakeholders is critical to getting funding from outside the region from the likes of Lotto or other charitable sources.
- Support for our vision of the Tararua Off-Road Cycle Loop to open access following a defined route along North and South Range Rd for walkers and cyclists to connect Te Apiti – Manawatu Gorge with Arapuke Forest Park. The Ashhurst Pedestrian Bridge and the planned off-road cycle path from Palmerston North to Linton Camp including a pedestrian/cycle bridge downstream of the Fitzherbert Bridge, complete the loop.
- Support for the trails planned on the Northern Gorge with access through the Meridian Te Apiti Windfarm. MMBC is keen to progress this option and can provide some assistance with planning and design of the bush trail to ToiToi point. We see this trail as a community project, with local community groups collaborating to get the bush trail complete. Further mountain bike trails can then be planned and accessed once this initial trail is in place.

WOODVILLE WATER. More information is needed prior to making a recommendation as it is my understanding there are more dairy cows on the town supply than towns people. It would be helpful if TDC provided a table of monthly draw, over the last two years, on the town water supply of cubic metres and broken down into usage rate categories, such as:

Domestic,
Commercial (in town businesses),
Life style blocks,
Dairy Farms, and
Other, e.g. contractor.

If statistics show that the major stake holder in water usage is one particular group, then any improvements to storage should be subject to targeted rates, i.e. user pays.

PENSIONER HOUSING. Again, not enough information has been provided and again it would be helpful if there were figures provided as to what the costs are likely to be.

4. **WOODVILLE BUILDINGS.** Again, more information is required as to the costs associated with the options you are suggesting.

KERBSIDE REFUSE COLLECTION. Again, more information is required as to the costs associated with the options you are suggesting.

PRIVATE USE OF COUNCIL VEHICLES. Recognising your support for the Enviroschools Programme

We would like to acknowledge Tararua District Council (TDC) for supporting young people in your region to be part of the Enviroschools network since 2013.

The Enviroschools Programme is a nationwide action-based education programme where young people plan, design and implement sustainability projects and become catalysts for change in their communities. Enviroschools was originally developed in the late 1990's by councils in Waikato as a non-regulatory tool and has now been adopted by 51 councils, including most larger councils and two-thirds of the total sector.

The programme is managed nationally by Toimata Foundation (a charitable trust). During April 2015 the name of our organisation changed from The Enviroschools Foundation to Toimata Foundation. The two programmes currently supported by the Foundation, Te Aho Tū Roa and Enviroschools, are retaining their current names, logos and identities. We wrote to the Mayor/Chair and Chief Executive of all our partner councils on the 20th April with more information about this change.

Toimata Foundation has funding from the Ministry for the Environment and works closely with the Department of Conservation. Regional implementation of Enviroschools is through partnerships with Local Government and other community agencies. This multi-sector collaboration has enabled nearly 1,000 schools and early childhood education (ECE) centres to now be involved – representing 30% of the school sector and 5% of the large early childhood sector.

Locally, two Tararua district schools are involved as well as one early childhood centre. With continued support for Enviroschools from TDC, the numbers participating will grow over time as the programme becomes more established in your district.

This submission encourages TDC to maintain its involvement in Enviroschools along with the other regional partner agencies – Horizons Regional Council, the Palmerston North City Council, the Whanganui and Manawatu District Councils, and the Ruahine Kindergarten Association. From 1 July 2015 Rangitikei District Council will also be an Enviroschools partner.

Highlights from recent programme evaluation

Toimata Foundation has been working with a team of external evaluators to quantify the actions undertaken and record the beneficial outcomes of the programme observed by schools and ECE centres participating in Enviroschools. In late 2014 a nationwide survey of all Enviroschools was conducted as part of the evaluation process. The survey is very robust, with a 73% response rate and highlights include:

- *Wide participation* - Schools were equally able to participate in the Enviroschools Programme across all deciles, sectors and regions.
- *All age groups (early childhood, primary and secondary) are taking environmental action* – across a wide variety of areas including waste, water, biodiversity, food production, energy and eco-building.
- *Community collaboration*- Enviroschools fosters significant community collaboration, creating leadership pathways for students and real connections to families, outside agencies and communities.
- *Zero Waste* – Almost all Enviroschools (100%)¹ are taking a range of actions to reduce waste.

¹ Due to rounding - of 688 schools surveyed, 686 are taking actions to reduce waste.

- *Food production* – Most EnviroSchools (97%) are growing and harvesting produce from their gardens/trees for cooking, selling and gifting.
- *Biodiversity projects are well developed, with clear links to community* – 96% of respondents had biodiversity projects with 86,859 trees planted in 2014 (86% of which were native trees).
- *Successful water projects* – Three quarters of EnviroSchools (75%) are undertaking a range of actions for water quality and conservation, including 19,264 meters of riparian planting in 2014.
- *Tackling energy usage* – Just over two-thirds of EnviroSchools (69%) are involved in energy projects, including actions for sustainable transport (47%) and energy conservation actions (34%).
- *EnviroSchools is contributing to a range of other outcomes* including citizenship, health, cultural understanding, motivated learners and community participation.
- *Depth of practice is related to the extent of outcomes* - Results showed that the depth of practice increases with the length of time a school or ECE centre is involved in EnviroSchools. Nearly two thirds of participating schools/centres (62%) report 'quite well developed' or 'deep embedded' practice. Further, the survey results show a clear link between depth of practice and the extent to which the programme is contributing to outcomes. This reinforces the value of the long-term approach of the EnviroSchools Programme.

Conclusion

The EnviroSchools Programme has a proven track record of being an effective approach for engaging schools and communities in environmental and social action.

With the backbone support of Toimata Foundation, and a network of councils around the country, the programme catalyses learning and action among thousands of young people, their families and communities from early childhood to secondary school. By connecting and coordinating resources and people, openly building and sharing knowledge across communities, widespread action is enabled on a broad scale.

As a funder, the partnership with EnviroSchools will provide TDC with multiple points of leverage across the Tararua community, extending the possible impact of its funding beyond what might be expected with a more traditional approach.
