- 13 Tennis Club Pavilion
A recommendation from TDC invited WDV to advise the Council of its proposals for the future use of the pavilion.
- 13.1 The structure is solid, Colin Veale has organised for the building to be secured. Members will clean the building out before it is secured. A letter will be sent to TDC advising them of this.
14. Fontaine Square problems
Ray advised that during the School Holidays there were about 40 children in the Square and the rotunda and Cenotaph were again vandalised. There have also been problems with youth drinking alcohol after sunset in the Square. The Police have been rung on a few occasions but have not responded to complaints and this is of great concern. Paul is to speak to Constable Mike Kist regarding this.
- 14.1 There is also concern amongst residents about bikes and skateboards in the main shopping area, and no respect for the elderly There seems to be no sense of community pride, It was suggested that the School be approached and asked about an Awareness Programme on community pride, Paul will speak to the Principal. Some suggested that this was a parental problem
