The where and what...

you can recycle these items

- Newspapers, magazines, junk mail, brochures
- Cardboard and non-foil wrapping paper
- Dry food packages – e.g. flattened cereal boxes
- Telephone directories
- Writing paper, and envelopes (including those with windows)
- Type 1, 2, 3, & 5 plastics – look for the recycling symbol, usually at the bottom of the container
- Plastic milk bottles, soft drink bottles
- Plastic shampoo/conditioner, household cleaner bottles
- Yoghurt pots, margarine tubs, ice-cream containers
- Drink cans – aluminium and steel
- Rinsed food tins
- Glass bottles and jars

No

you cannot recycle these items

- Household rubbish, food waste
- Polystyrene – including meat trays
- Disposable nappies
- Plastic bags
- Hot ashes, garden waste
- Seedling or plant pots
- Drinking glasses
- Window or windscreen glass
- Mirrors – frosted or crystal glass
- Light bulbs
- Ceramics, crockery, porcelain
- Old clothes, shoes
- Computers, household batteries
- Toys, buckets, or baskets
- Bubble wrap or shrink wrap
- Paint tins, fuel oil containers
- Containers/bottles larger than 4 litres
- Shellfish and fish waste
- Other toxic material

# Kerbside Refuse and Recycling Collection

## How the system works

### Refuse Collection

Bags placed at the kerbside on collection days must either be yellow Budget Waste prepaid bags, or the bag must display a Tararua District Council refuse label.

Each bag must be able to be lifted by one person, and be no more than 15kg in weight.

If you use the Council refuse labels, you may use any type of rubbish bag you like, provided it securely holds its contents. For example, you can use the bag that the dog biscuits, potting mix, or fertilizer came in. Alternatively, you can buy plastic or paper bags from your supermarket.

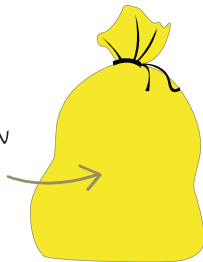
There are two types of Council refuse labels available:

**Red labels for large bags:** labels for large bags are \$3.75 each.

**Green labels for small bags:** one \$2.00 label can be used for two standard sized grocery bags tied together.

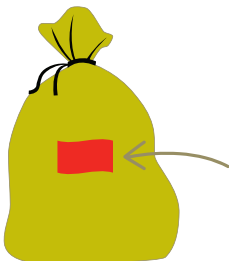

Refuse bags should be placed at the kerbside by 7:00am on the day of collection, with the refuse label facing the street.

If the collection falls on a public holiday, it may – but not necessarily – be postponed to the next working day. If the date is to be changed, it will be advertised in the newspaper.

### Kerbside Recycling Collection

Kerbside recycling is currently available in Dannevirke, Norsewood, Ormondville, Woodville, Pahiatua, Makuri, Pongaroa, Eketahuna, Alfredton, Herbertville, and Akitio.

All recycling must be separated out into individual, securely tied, supermarket bags and placed at the kerbside by 7:00am on the day of collection. Plastic, paper, cardboard and cans will be collected kerbside. **Please note, there is no kerbside collection for glass.**
