- The Council is to send a letter to Transpower regarding the annual maintenance shutdown, to try and get a more suitable arrangement.
- The Council has agreed to support Radio Woodville on the issue of the licence fee.
- The People's Network computers were removed from the library the day after the last WDV meeting. They will be returned once a resolution of the problem is determined.
- The electronic height gauge at the Woodville reservoir has now been installed.
- The advocacy and consultation policies have been adopted, with some alterations as a result of the submissions received.
- Water continues to be a very precious item throughout the district, and we must hope that autumn rains are not too far away.
- The Tararua Sportsman of the Year awards will be held in Pahiatua on April 24<sup>th</sup>, and nominations are now sought – the closing date is March 21<sup>st</sup>.
