

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



SOCIAL SUPPORT

My kids are struggling and fearful as a result of the cyclone's impact. What do I do?

Children and young people are sometimes very frightened by these types of weather events. You could talk to your doctor to discuss medical options or referrals to wellbeing support. The Tararua Cyclone Gabrielle Recovery web pages www.tararuadc.govt.nz/recovery have a number of support options.

I feel like I am struggling / I know people who have been struggling since the cyclone, can we access Mental Health Support?

Feeling all sorts of emotions is normal - free support is at hand. If you or someone you know needs further tautoko/support, it's okay to ask for help. No one should go through a tough time alone. I have some free time and specific skills, is there any need for volunteers still?

HOMES/HOUSES/BUILDINGS

How many buildings in the Tararua District were affected by Cyclone Gabrielle?

As at 21 June 2023 we have three red-stickered buildings (two homes and the Waione Hall); and 13 yellow-stickered homes. The building team are working with affected homeowners on the next steps they need to take, so that the categorisation can be reassessed.



INSURANCE

Will my insurance pay out if I have to leave my red or yellow stickered home? You will need to discuss your individual situation with your insurance company.

I don't have any insurance. Is there any support available?

Our roads are very muddy. Can you put some metal down?

The Tararua Alliance are getting around the district trying to prioritise works. You can report issues and receive updates on the phone app Antenno - www.tararuadc.govt.nz/contact-us/antenno.

When will our closed or restricted roads be fixed?

The Tararua Alliance is working as fast as they can to make sure people have access and can continue to operate i.e. farms can get stock in and out. They need to know if there's any continuing access issues for individuals or families, as this will help prioritise works. Contact via the Tararua District Council Telephone 24 Hours, 7 Days - 06 374 4080 (North), 06 376 0110 (South). The majority of slips that have been impacting road carriageways (lanes) are now cleared. Critical works have started to restore access for communities where large-scale damage has occurred (River Road, Marainanga Gorge, Rakaiatia Road Bridge). Report any issues and receive updates via the phone app Antenno - www.tararuadc.govt.nz/contact-us/antenno.

Waka Kotahi has approved event recovery funding to assist with the initial response (clearing slips/trees, reopening roads); undertaking works to stabilise the roading network (opening water channels, clear blocked culverts, remove debris from bridge piers) prior to 2023 winter; and starting the investigation, design and engineering of complex sites.

As at 21 June 2023:

2357 roading faults have been identified

88 high complexity faults identified

435 medium complexity faults identified

1560 low complexity faults identified

248 faults are still to be categorised



FARM SUPPORT

My crops / farmland / stock have been heavily impacted by the cyclone. Is there assistance for farmers?

What's happening with debris management in the rivers? Whose responsibility is the clean-up?

Horizons checked any urgent issues at the time of the cyclone and these have now been dealt with. The River Management Team have undertaken a number of landowner visits and have recently carried out a further aerial inspection of the Akitio and Wainui Rivers.
